HONORING A LEADER

BOARDROOM RENAMED IN HONOR OF MOSE COLEMAN

Southeastern Technical College Foundation dedicated a boardroom to legendary Vidalia citizen Moses “Mose” M. Coleman, Jr. on Thursday, February 3, 2022.

“Mose was a pillar of the community when where we are standing was just dirt, trees, and forest,” STC President Larry Calhoun emphasized. “He was one of the founding fathers of Southeastern Tech and supported it mightily through the years. It was an institute, but now we are a technical college with the same accreditation that Georgia Tech or University of Georgia have.

STC’s Foundation Treasurer Dennis Ingley commented on Coleman’s impact on the area during his lifetime. “Anyone who got to know him knew that he was dedicated to this area, his family, this community, and education.” Ingley continued, “He would give in all kinds of ways. He often gave his time and resources – things other than money. He gave a lot of money to the college, but I don’t think the money is any comparison to what he really gave. He gave himself to the college and the community, and we certainly appreciate that about him.”

Coleman graduated with an electrical engineering degree from Georgia Tech before beginning to work Raytheon Corporation as a defense contractor outside of Boston.

When the NASA rocket program was going on in Huntsville, Alabama, Coleman continued to work as a defense contractor but then began working on the program trying to get American aircraft to the moon. He eventually moved to Huntsville to work on the space program at Redstone Arsenal for Brown Engineering and Sperry Rand, where he worked on a telemetry project for Saturn Rockets.

Coleman returned to Vidalia and began working as a young entrepreneur with his father at Coleman Paper Company and at Coleman Sales.

Coleman’s grandson Tommy Branch said, “We are really grateful to you for recognizing him. He had a one-of-a-kind love for others that was very rare.”

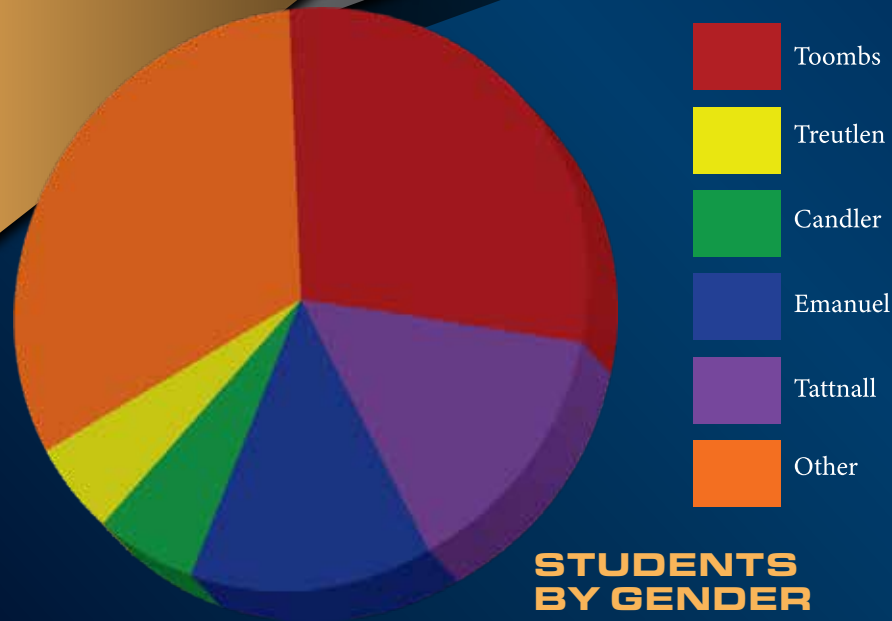
Calhoun commented, “I really think it is appropriate that the Foundation he was such a big part of getting started had the idea to name this boardroom, which is fairly new and larger than the original one, after him, and it is representative of the growth that he contributed and got started.”

The STC Foundation presented a plaque that is displayed outside of the boardroom and shared an official statement regarding the dedication which reads: Soon after Mr. Coleman passed away, the Southeastern Technical College Foundation made the recommendation that the boardroom on the Vidalia campus be named in his honor. They felt this was an appropriate way to show appreciation for Mr. Coleman’s dedication and support of STC and technical education. Mr. Coleman was a founding trustee of the former Southeastern Technical Institute, serving for 10 years, after which he served on the STC Board of Directors for three years. We are tremendously grateful for his life and for the generosity he showed us with both his time and financial resources.



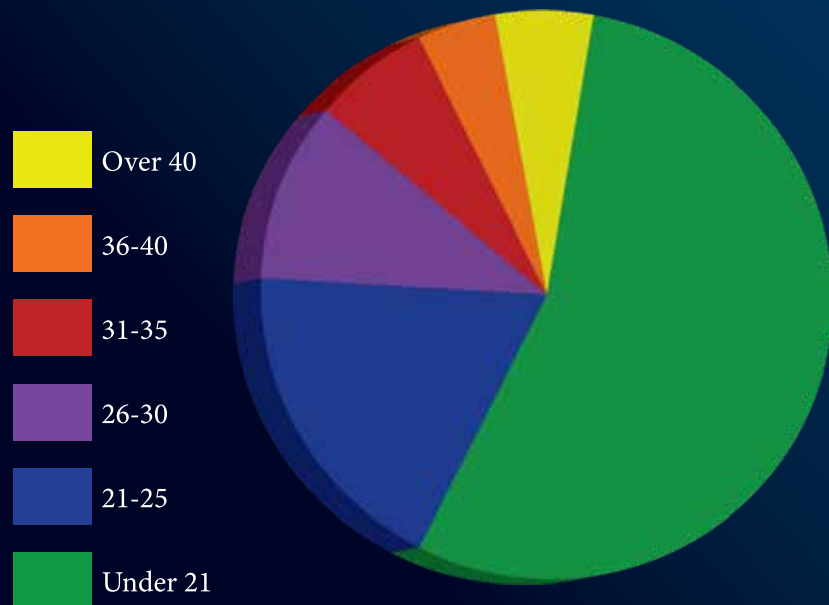

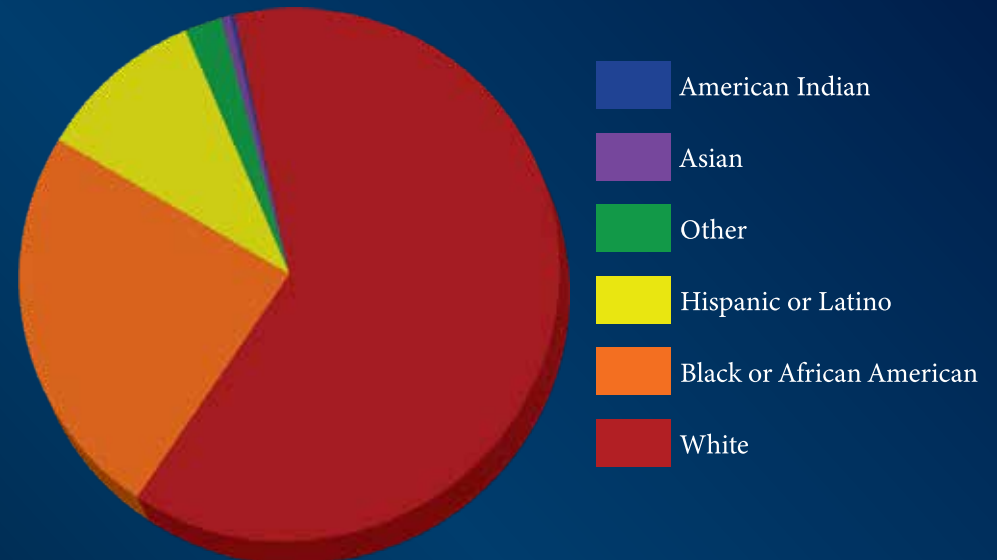

Adult Education offers virtual enrollment as well as on-site enrollment.

All instructors are trained and offer classes through Blackboard.

Mobile testing is available to take High School Equivalency (HSE) testing into the service areas for students who lack transportation to our Swainsboro or Vidalia testing sites.

Adult Education provides HSE testing to the largest number of state prisons (10); provides HSE preparation classes in four facilities; and provides HSE testing on the Swainsboro Campus for two facilities that transport detainees for testing.

The Adult Education program at Southeastern Tech provides students the opportunity to receive a High School Equivalency and participate in Integrated Education and Training Programs while earning their HSE. From the most basic studies to English as a Second Language, the Adult Education program serves a variety of students at various levels.

Southeastern Tech has an eight-county service area with adult education centers in Glennville, Metter, Millen, Mount Vernon, Reidsville, Soperton, Swainsboro, Vidalia, and Wrightsville. Classes are at no charge to students. Students who obtain their HSE and go on to further their education at a technical college receive a \$500 voucher for continuing their education.

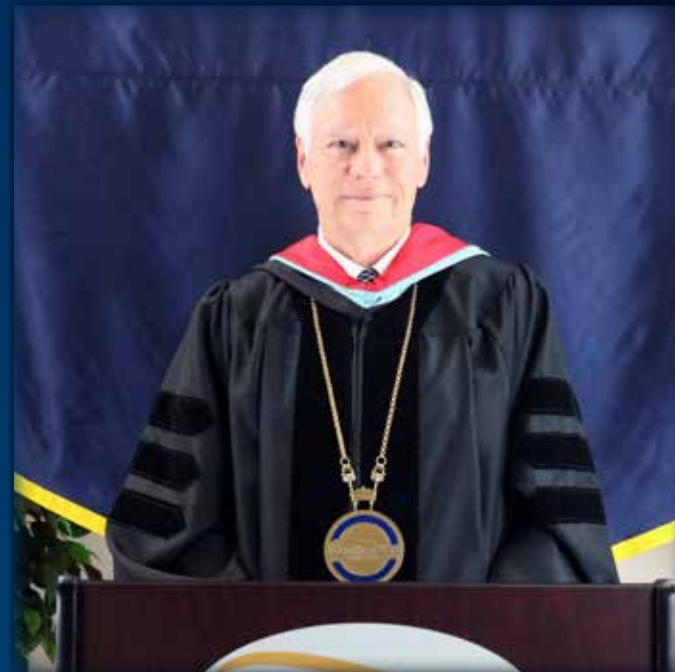

FUNDING PRIORITIES

Scholarships and Emergency Support

The Foundation provides over \$40,000 in scholarships for tuition, fees, books, transportation, and emergencies each year. The demand for assistance is far greater than what current funds provide.

Establish New Programs

Southeastern Technical College focuses on establishing programs that are needed to provide a trained workforce for 1) existing business and industry to remain competitive and 2) attract new business and industry to the area. The state provides some of the funding to establish new programs; however, additional funding is needed to establish new health and industrial programs for our community.

Supplement Adult Education Funding

Approximately a third of adults 25 years of age and older in Candler, Emanuel, Jenkins, Johnson, Montgomery, Tattnall, Toombs, and Treutlen counties do not hold a high school diploma or equivalency. Many of these citizens do not have transportation and it is critical that classes are accessible for this population. Also, exam fees have increased which deters many from taking the exam. Funding is needed to supplement this program.

Maintain and Expand State-of-the-Art Technology

Every educational program at STC is driven by technology. Maintaining equipment is a costly and continuous process. Additional funding is needed to provide students with state-of-the-art equipment to complete in a global economy.
